Frensham Heights School (Grass Pitches) - WHEN AND HOW TO REACT TO A LIFE-THREATENING SITUATION



Club Name: Churt Juniors Football Club.

Location Address: Frensham Heights School, Rowledge, Farnham, Surrey. GU10 4EA.

Frensham Heights School Onsite Team: None.

First Aider: Qualified FA Emergency First Aid, 1st Response.

- React to an incident.
- Scene assessment and safe approach to an injured player.
- Assessment/primary survey of a player's Response/Airway/Breathing.
- Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR).
- Secondary survey of a players Head to Toe Examination.
- An ambulance should be called for as soon as it is recognised that a player has a life-threatening condition or serious injury/illness.
- Deliver 1st aid kit.
- Send for AED (Automated External Defibrillator) AVAILABLE FOR USE SEE OPPOSITE FOR AED INFORMATION.
- Have access to any player's medical history.
- Recovery Position.

Support: No2 QFA/Parent/Nominated Helpers.

Nominate a chain of helpers (no's 3, 4 and so on) to:

- Make the call/provide 3-way conversation with emergency services.
- Fetch AED (If requested by emergency services. See opposite for AED information, and available from ambulance service).
- Consider players existing medical conditions/information, parent/guardian.
- Confirm emergency access is clear and be ready to direct ambulance.
- Give assistance to ambulance, access from main road entrance (flag down).
- Ambulance access to pitches from the access road/car park, but only if deemed necessary by Ambulance crew once injury reviewed by them.
- Manage parents and other players, disperse on lookers and clear scene for privacy and to avoid traumatising other players/parents.

Recognition of Concussion (Brain injury).

FA Concussion Guidelines. Are any of the symptoms evident? If so, then the player should cease activity. Remember – If in doubt, sit them out!

AED Information:

The AED is located on the front of the pavilion, to the left of the entrance.
